20	1. Dr. Michael Marion, Jr. (Complainant) brings this Second Amended Statement of	
21	Issues solely in his official capacity as the Chief of the Bureau for Private Postsecondary	
22	Education, Department of Consumer Affairs.	
	2. On or about December 8, 2015, the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education	
23	received an application for an Approval to Operate an Institution Non-Accredited from Online	
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25	Vocational Academy, Inc. (Respondent). On or about December 7, 2015, David Pinnell certified	
26	under penalty of perjury to the truthfulness of all statements, answers, and representations in the	
27	application. The Bureau denied the application on	September 28, 2017.

REGULATORY PROVISIONS 8. Title 5, California Code of Regulations (CCR), section 71100 states: (a) An applicant seeking approval to operate pursuant to Section 94886 of the Code, other than Approval to Operate by Accreditation pursuant to Section 94890(a)(1) of the Code, shall complete the "Application for Approval to Operate for an Institution Not Accredited," Form Application 94886 (rev. 2/10). An applicant seeking approval to operate by accreditation pursuant to Section 94890(a)(1) of the Code shall comply with section 71390. (b) An applicant shall submit the completed form, the information or documentation required by this Article, the appropriate application fee as provided in Section 94930.5(a)(1) of the Code, and any appropriate annual fee as required by Article 1 of Chapter 5 of this Division, to the Bureau. (c) An application that fails to contain all of the information required by this article shall render it incomplete. 9. Title 5, CCR, section 71700 states: to operate. 10. Title 5, CCR section 71710 states in part:

The Bureau may request that an institution document compliance with the standards set forth in the Act and this Division to obtain and maintain an approval

In order to meet its mission and objectives, the educational program defined in section 94837 of the Code shall be comprised of a curriculum that includes:

- (e) specific learning outcomes tied to the sequence of the presentation of the material to measure the students' learning of the material; and,
- (f) evaluation by duly qualified faculty of those learning outcomes.
- Title 5, CCR, section 71715 states in part: 11.

(d) Distance education as defined in section 94834 of the Code, does not require the physical presence of students and faculty at the same location but provides for interaction between students and faculty by such means as telecommunication, correspondence, electronic and computer augmented educational services, postal service, and facsimile transmission. In addition to the other requirements of this chapter and the Act, an institution offering distance education shall:

(1) ensure that the educational program offered through distance education is appropriate for delivery through distance education methods;

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educational programs and the school catalog, among other things. The Bureau requested additional information be submitted by August 15, 2017.

- 16. On August 15, 2017, the Bureau received Respondent's response to the second deficiency letter. The Bureau denied Respondent's Application for Approval to Operate a Non-Accredited Institution and sent Respondent a "Notice of Denial" on September 28, 2017.
- 17. On or about February 15, 2019 and February 22, 2019, Respondent submitted additional documents in support of its application for an approval to operate. The additional documents submitted corrected some deficiencies but an additional deficiency was discovered in the newly submitted documents.
- 18. On or about March 14, 2019, Respondent submitted additional documents in support of its application for an approval to operate. The additional documents submitted corrected some deficiencies but new deficiencies were discovered in the newly submitted documents.
- 19. On or about July 15, 2019, Respondent again submitted additional documents in support of its application for an approval to operate. The additional documents submitted corrected some but not all deficiencies.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Demonstrate Capacity to Satisfy Minimum Operating Standards - Student Assessment Prior to Admission)

- 20. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Code section 94887 and title 5, CCR, sections 71100, 71700, 71710 and 71715, for failing to demonstrate its capacity to satisfy minimum operating standards as follows:
- a. Respondent's 2018 catalog failed to demonstrate how Respondent will assess each student, prior to admission, in order to determine whether each student has the skills and competencies needed to succeed in a distance education environment, in violation of title 5, CCR, 71715(d)(2).
 - b. Respondent's 2019 catalog identified admissions requirements that include
 - ✓ Have access to a computer and an internet connection
 - ✓ Be able to turn on and off a computer.
