Christina Villanueva issues this Citation: Assessment of Fine and Order of Abatement (Citation) in her official capacity as Discipline Manager of the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education (Bureau) of the California Department of Consumer Affairs.

<u>CITATION</u>

A Citation is hereby issued to Quattro Barber Colleges, Corp Level I, Owner of Moler Barber College (Institution) located at 3815 Telegraph, Oakland, CA, 94609, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.9; California Education Code (CEC) sections 94936 and 94932; and Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations (5, CCR) section 75020 for the violations described below.

BACKGROUND

On May 21, 2019, the Bureau conducted an unannounced Compliance inspection at the Institution. During the inspection, Bureau staff gave the Institution representatives a letter which included a request for the supporting documentation for the 2015-2016 School Performance Fact Sheets (SPFS) and a deficiency letter that identified violations with the 2016 Annual Report and 2015-2016 SPFS. The Institution's representatives informed Bureau staff that they do not offer the Barbering Instructor, Cosmetology, Re-enrollment, and Refresher course programs at the Oakland location, and they do not have a SPFS for those specific programs. Bureau staff informed the Institution representatives that a SPFS is required for each Bureau approved program.

In addition, Bureau staff provided the Institution representatives with a list that outlined the requirements they needed to provide, and the Institution representatives stated they needed additional time to sort and retrieve the supporting documentation.

On May 30, 2019, Bureau staff received an email from an Institution representative that contained two excel documents identified as the "2016 SPFS Cosmetology Crossover backup documentation" and the "2016 SPFS Barbering backup documentation." Bureau staff reviewed the SPFS spreadsheets and determined the spreadsheets did not capture all the data points as outlined in 5, CCR section 74112 (m)(1-9).

In addition, thirteen minor violations were unable to be cleared before the end of the inspection. The Institution was issued Notice to Comply (NTC) #CU 0101031 0519 and was given thirty days from the date of the inspection to either remedy all violations listed in the NTC or submit a written Notice of Disagreement. The Bureau did not receive a response from the Institution.

VIOLATION

Violation: 5, CCR Section 74112(a)(h)(i)(k)(m)(1-9) – Uniform Data – Annual Report, Performance Fact Sheet (a) Format. The format for the Performance Fact Sheet shall be in at least 12 pt. type, in an easily readable font, with 1.15 line spacing and all titles and column headings shall be in bold 14 pt. type, which shall also identify the program for which the Performance Fact Sheet pertains. The Performance Fact Sheet shall contain all and only the information required or specifically permitted by sections 94910 and 94929.5 of the Code or this chapter. A separate Performance Fact Sheet shall be prepared for each program. (h) Completion Rates. Reporting of completion rates for an institution's Annual Report and Performance Fact Sheet shall include, for each educational program, the number of students who began the program as defined in subdivision (d)(1) of this section, the number of students available for graduation, number of on-time graduates, and completion rate(s). An optional table may be added to include completion rate data for students completing within 150% of the published program length. For an institution reporting completion data pursuant to section 94929(b) of the Code, completion data shall be separately reported for each program and the Performance Fact Sheet shall disclose, if true, that the completion data is being reported for students completing within 150% of the published program length, and that data is not being separately reported for students completing the program within 100% of the published program length. (8) for each student determined to be unavailable for graduation or unavailable for employment, the identity of the student, the type of unavailability, the dates of unavailability, and the documentation of the unavailability; and

(9) the name, email address, phone number, and position or title of the institution's representative who was primarily responsible for obtaining the students' completion, placement, licensing, and salary and wage data, the date that the information was gathered, and copies of notes, letters or emails through which the information was requested and gathered.

CEC Section 94929 (a) -Reporting of Completion Rate

(a) An institution shall annually report to the bureau, as part of the annual report, and publish in its School Performance Fact Sheet, the completion rate for each program. Except as provided in subdivision (b), the completion rate shall be calculated by dividing the number of on-time graduates by the number of students available for graduation.

CEC Section 94929.5 (a)(2)(3)-Reporting of Student Performance Data

(a) An institution shall annually report to the bureau, as part of the annual report, and shall publish in its School Performance Fact Sheet, all of the following:

(2) The license examination passage rates for the immediately preceding two years for programs leading to employment for which passage of a state licensing examination is required, calculated by dividing the number of graduates who pass the examination by the number of graduates who take the licensing examination the first time that the examination is available after completion of the educational program. The institution shall use state agency licensing data to calculate license examination passage rates. If those data are unavailable, the institution shall calculate the license examination passage rate in a manner consistent with regulations adopted by the bureau.
(3) Salary and wage information, consisting of the total number of graduates employed in the field and the annual wages or salaries of those graduates stated in increments of five thousand dollars (\$5,000).

SPFS Violations:

Violation: 5, CCR Section 74112 (a): The Institution failed to create and maintain a SPFS for the following programs: Barbering Instructor, Cosmetology, Re-enrollment, and Refresher course.

Violation: 5, CCR Section 74112 (i): The 2015-2016 SPFS for the Cosmetology Crossover program contained inconsistent data and tables for the 2015 Total Graduates Employed in the Field. According to the Job Placement table, the school reported 9 Graduates Employed in the Field, compared to the 10 Total Graduates Employed in the Field reported within the Part-Time vs. Full Time table, Single Position vs. Concurrent Aggregated Position table, Self Employed/Freelance Position table, and Institutional Employment table.

Violation: 5, CCR Section 74112 (k): The 2015-2016 SPFS for the Cosmetology Crossover program Salary and Wage Information table contained inconsistent data for the 2015 Graduates Available for

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Employment section. According to the information reported on the SPFS for the 2015 calendar year, the Institution reported 10 students for the Graduates Available for Employment in the Job Placement section, however, the Institution reported 14 students in the table for Graduates Available for Employment in the Salary and Wage information.

Violation: 5, CCR Section 74112 (m)(1-9): The supporting documentation for the 2016 SPFS Cosmetology Crossover and Barbering programs did not capture all of the data points as outlined in 5, CCR Section 74112 (m)(1-9).

Violation: CEC Section 94929.5 (a)(2): The 2015-2016 SPFS for the Barbering program Licensing Examination Passage Rate table contained calculation errors with its 2015 Passage Rate. According to the information reported on the 2015 SPFS, the school reported the number of students taking the exam was 72 and the number of students who passed the first available exam was 51. Based on the data for Licensure information reported for 2015, the passage rate should be 70.8%, however the Institution reported a passage rate of 74%.

Violation: CEC Section 94929.5 (a)(3): The 2015-2016 SPFS for the Barbering program and Cosmetology Crossover program Salary and Wage Information tables failed to report the annual wages or salaries in increments of five thousand dollars (\$5,000). The Institution used the following increments of \$10,000 and above: \$5,001-\$25,000, \$25,000-\$35,000, \$35,001-\$45,000, \$45,001-\$75,000.

Annual Report Violation:

Violation: CEC Section 94929 (a): The 2016 Annual Report Section 2 Program data submitted for the Cosmetology Crossover program contained calculation errors with its completion rate. The Institution reported 18 students were available for graduation and 2 on-time graduates. Based on the data for On-Time Completion rates reported for 2016, the rate should be 11, however the Institution reported a rate of 9.

SPFS & Annual Report Violations:

Violation: 5, CCR Section 74112 (h): The 2015-2016 SPFS for the Barbering Program contained calculation errors with the 150% Completion Rate for the 2015 reporting calendar year. The school reported 119 students were available for graduation and 51 students for the 150% graduates. Based on the data report for 2015 150% graduates, the completion rate should be 42.8%, however the school reported a rate of 90%.

The 2016 Annual Report Section 2 Program data submitted for the Barbering program, contained reporting errors with its 150% Completion Rate. According to the 2015-2016 SPFS for the Barbering program, the school reported 85 students were available for graduation and 69 for its 150% graduates, resulting in 150% Completion Rate of 81%. However, the Institution reported a completion rate of 69%.

Order of Abatement:

The Bureau orders the Institution shall submit a written policy of how future compliance with 5, CCR section 74112 and CEC Sections 94929 (a) and 94929.5 will be maintained.

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ASSESSMENT OF A FINE

In accordance with CEC section 94936; and 5, CCR sections 75020 and 75030, the Bureau hereby orders this assessment of fine in the amount of **\$5,601.00** for the violations described above. **Payment must be made, to the Bureau, within <u>30 days</u> from the date of service of the Citation.**

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COMPLIANCE WITH ORDER OF ABATEMENT

In accordance with the provisions of CEC section 94936 and 5, CCR section 75020 the Bureau hereby issues the order(s) of abatement described above. **Evidence of compliance with the order(s) of abatement must be submitted, to the Bureau, within** <u>30 days</u> from the date of service of the Citation.

APPEAL OF CITATION

You have the right to contest this Citation through an informal conference with the Bureau; and/or through an administrative hearing in accordance with Chapter 5 (Commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code.

If you wish to contest this Citation, you must submit the 'Notice of Appeal of Citation – Request for Informal Conference and/or Administrative Hearing' form (enclosed) within <u>30 days</u> from the date of service of the Citation. *If you do not request an informal conference and/or an administrative hearing within 30 days from the service of the Citation, you will not be able to request one at a later time.*

Unless a written request for an informal conference and/or an administrative hearing is signed by you and delivered to the Bureau by **September 4, 2019**, you will be deemed to have waived or forfeited your right to appeal this matter.

EFFECTIVE DATE OF CITATION

If you do not request an informal conference and/or an administrative hearing, this Citation shall become effective on **September 4, 2019**. Payment of the administrative fine and evidence of compliance with the order(s) of abatement shall be due by **October 4, 2019**. Your payment of the administrative fine shall not constitute an admission of the violation(s) charged.

If a hearing is requested, you will not be required to comply with this Citation until 30 days after a final order is entered against you.
