22	1. Deborah Cochrane (Complainant) brings this Statement of Issues solely in her officia	
23	capacity as the Chief of the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, Department of	
24	Consumer Affairs.	
25	2. On or about October 5, 2021, the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education	
26	(Bureau) received an Application for Verification of Exempt Status from School of Healing	
27	Touch (Respondent), owned by Hussein F. Azar. The application sought verification from the	
28	Bureau that Respondent's private postsecondary educational institution, known as "School of	
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Healing Touch," is exempt from regulation pursuant to Education Code section 94874, subdivisions (a) and (f). On or about February 14, 2022, the Bureau denied Respondent's application. On or about March 21, 2022, Respondent requested an administrative hearing regarding the Bureau's denial of his application.

JURISDICTION

- 3. This Statement of Issues is brought before the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs (Director) for the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the California Education Code unless otherwise indicated.
 - 4. Section 94886 states:

"Except as exempted in Article 4 (commencing with Section 94874) or in compliance with the transition provisions in Article 2 (commencing with Section 94802), a person shall not open, conduct, or do business as a private postsecondary educational institution in this state without obtaining an approval to operate under this chapter."

5. Section 94817 states:

"'Approval to operate' or 'approval' means the authorization pursuant to this chapter to offer to the public and to provide postsecondary educational programs, as well as the written document issued to an institution signifying its approval to operate."

6. Section 94857 states:

"Postsecondary education' means a formal institutional educational program whose instruction is designed primarily for students who have completed or terminated their secondary education or are beyond the compulsory age of secondary education, including programs whose purpose is academic, vocational, or continuing professional education."

7. Section 94858 states:

"Private postsecondary educational institution' means a private entity with a physical presence in this state that offers postsecondary education to the public for an institutional charge."

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8. Section 94875 states, in part:

"The bureau shall regulate private postsecondary educational institutions through the powers granted, and duties imposed, by this chapter. In exercising its powers, and performing its duties, the protection of the public shall be the bureau's highest priority. If protection of the public is inconsistent with other interests sought to be promoted, the protection of the public shall be paramount."

9. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71400.5 states, in part, that proceedings related to denial of an application "shall be conducted in accordance with Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code."

RELEVANT STATUTORY AND REGULATORY PROVISIONS

10. Education Code section 94874, subdivisions (a) and (f) states:

"Except as provided in Sections 94874.2, 94874.7, and 94927.5, the following are exempt from this chapter:

"(a) An institution that offers solely avocational or recreational educational programs.

. . .

- "(f) An institution that does not award degrees and that solely provides educational programs for total charges of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) or less when no part of the total charges is paid from state or federal student financial aid programs. The bureau may adjust this cost threshold based upon the California Consumer Price Index and post notification of the adjusted cost threshold on its internet website as the bureau determines, through the promulgation of regulations, that the adjustment is consistent with the intent of this chapter."
 - 11. Education Code section 94818 states:

"Avocational education' means education offered for the purpose of personal entertainment, pleasure, or enjoyment."

- 12. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 70000, subdivision (x) states:
- "(x) 'Recreational Education' means education offered for the purpose of teaching the fundamentals, skills or techniques of sports or games."

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California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71395, subdivisions (a) and (b) state,

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SECOND CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Exempt Status Pursuant to Section 94874, subd. (f))

- 15. Respondent's application is subject to denial in that the application and supporting documentation offered by Respondent do not demonstrate that Respondent's institution does not award degrees and solely provides educational programs for total charges of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) or less when no part of the total charges is paid from state or federal student financial aid programs. (Education Code § 94874, subd. (f).) In particular:
- (a) The completion certificates and program descriptions Respondent submitted include conflicting information regarding the programs being offered by the institution. The application includes program descriptions for several programs; however, the program names listed on the certificates do not match the program names provided. As a result, the Bureau is unable to verify that the institution meets the requirements of Section 94874, subdivision (f).
- (b) Respondent's application includes a "cost" of each program; however, the application does not include a breakdown of the total cost for each educational program offered by Respondent's institution. As a result, the application does not comply with California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71395, subdivision (b)(9), and the Bureau is unable to verify that the institution meets the requirements of Section 94874, subdivision (f).

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs issue a decision:

- 1. Denying the Application for Verification of Exempt Status, submitted by Respondent School of Healing Touch, owned by Hussein F. Azar.; and
 - 2. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
